BY AWARD-WINNING PLAYWRIGHT ROBERT SCHENKKAN AUGUST 30-SEPTEMBER 10, 2017 AT THE OSCAR G. BROCKETT THEATRE

From Pulitzer Prize and Tony Award®-winning playwright Robert Schenkkan (*All the Way, The Kentucky Cycle, Hacksaw Ridge*), comes the incendiary political thriller that is captivating audiences across the country. The University of Texas at Austin Department of Theatre and Dance presents *Building the Wall*, directed by Brant Pope, August 30-September 10, 2017 at the Oscar G. Brockett Theatre.

Written in "a white heat" fury following the November 2016 election, Schenkkan's *Building the Wall* imagines a dystopia impacted by President Trump's border and immigration policies. It's the near future and millions of undocumented immigrants have been detained in overflowing prisons. Now, a writer interrogates the director of a private prison as he

awaits sentencing for carrying out the federal policy that has escalated into the unimaginable. This riveting and illuminating drama delivers a powerful warning and puts a human face on the inhuman, revealing how, when personal accountability is denied, what seems inconceivable becomes inevitable.

Building the Wall first opened in March at Los Angeles' Fountain Theatre where it has been extended three times, with performances continuing to sell out nightly. "We are honored to present the regional premiere of our alumnus' work," shares Brant Pope, the play's director and chair of the Department of Theatre and Dance. "This is a thrilling and terrifying play concerning people and the issues vitally important to Texas and the region." The production features a professional cast, including Franchelle Stewart Dorn as "Gloria" and David Sitler as "Rick."

The production of *Building the Wall* is the centerpiece for a series of panels taking place September 7, 2017, which bring together the public, playwrights, directors and arts critics in a dialogue about new play development and production.

ABOUT ROBERT SCHENKKAN

In 2014, All The Way won the Tony Award®, Drama Desk, Outer Critics, Drama League, Kennedy Prize and the TCA/Steinberg Awards for Best Play and broke two Broadway box office records. Schenkkan has since adapted All The Way as a feature film for HBO, produced by Steven Spielberg and starring Bryan Cranston. Schenkkan's other works on Broadway include the Pulitzer Prize-winning epic, *The Kentucky Cycle*, which also won the LA Drama Critics Award and was nominated for the Tony, Drama Desk and the Outer Critics' Circle Awards. Other plays include Hanussen (2017 Denver Summit Theater Festival), Shadowplay, Lewis and Clark Reach the Euphrates, By the Rivers of Babylon, Handler, The Marriage of Miss Hollywood and King Neptune, Heaven on Earth, Tachinoki, Final Passages, The Devil and Daniel Webster, The Dream Thief, A Single Shard and The Great Society, part two of the LBJ Plays, anticipated in New York in 2018. His musical, The Twelve, received its world premiere in Denver in 2015 and won the Henry Award for Best New Play/Musical. Films: *Hacksaw Ridge* (2016, Nominated for six Academy Awards®); *The* Quiet American. Television: The Pacific (Nominated for two Emmys and received a WGA Award). Other television work includes: *The Andromeda Strain, Crazy Horse* and *Spartacus*. robertschenkkan.com

She has been seen on *Law and Order* and as "Dr. Rita Madison," on NBC's *Another World* and films *Die Hard with a Vengeance, Chances Are* and *Raise the Titanic*. She can also be seen on one of PBS' longest-running series, *Literary Visions*. Dorn has been nominated for seven Helen Hayes Awards and has been the recipient of three. She has also won the Austin Critics' Table Award for her performances in *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf?, Mrs. Warren's Profession, The Edge of Peace* and *Medea*.
